

The agreement runs from April 1st to October 31st, 2022, with options to renew by October 15th. Having a meeting and turning area with full-time access is a brand new idea for the PRW and opens us to many turning / training / sales opportunities.

Store your frequently used finishes by your lathe in WELL MARKED small plastic lidded bottles - Old shampoo bottles work well. Put several STAINLESS nuts or bolts inside, then shake the bottle before each use. A flip of the cap opens or closes. Squirt a small amount on your applicator rag, and you're on your way.

Always borrow tools from pessimists – They won't expect to get them back.

Professionalism in woodturning is not about "full-time", "sales", "volume of productivity", or "efficiency". It's really about the quality and personality of the end product you create.







Membership


