AAW Virus Concerns

People worldwide are facing concerns about the COVID-19 epidemic.

We'd like you to know that the AAW leadership is carefully monitoring the status of COVID-19 in preparation for our 34th Annual International Symposium, June 4-7, in Louisville, KY. The health and safety of our members, demonstrators, trade show vendors, partners, and other event attendees is our absolute and utmost priority.

We remain watchfully optimistic that the AAW Symposium will go forward. Based on all available guidance as of March 12, the symposium is still scheduled to occur in June.

Any changes to this plan will be made based on available evidence and recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the World Health Organization (WHO), the Kentucky Department of Health, and other health authorities. Our professional conference management partner, ConferenceDirect, is actively communicating with the Louisville Convention and Visitor Bureau, our group hotels, and the Kentucky Exposition Center, the venue for the 2020 event. These ongoing discussions ensure regular and full sharing of information between AAW organizers and local authorities.

The AAW Symposium is 85 days away and the COVID-19 situation continues to evolve. Should anything change in our symposium planning, we will promptly notify you. We understand that the uncertainty is difficult and thank you for your understanding and patience as we thoroughly assess what is in the best interest of all our constituents.

For those who have already registered for the AAW Symposium, and for those still planning to register, we have waived early cancellation fees. If future developments challenge us with a difficult but necessary decision to cancel the symposium, all registration fees will be refunded in full.

We will continue to update you as new information becomes available via email, AAW social media sites, and the AAW website. A list of the onsite measures AAW will be taking, can be found at the bottom of this webpage. We have consolidated COVID-19 FAQs and travel information from reliable international, national, state and local health and regulatory agencies on this page, which will be updated frequently.

The Silver Fox Tips from Past Experience...

Store your frequently-used finishes in PROPERLY LABELED flip-top small plastic shampoo bottles, close to your lathe. Put several small bolts or nuts in the bottle, and shake before each use. A flip of the top opens or closes with one hand! Small controlled squirts onto a paper towel (a rag might snag on a spinning lathe!) for easy application, and you're well on your way to a beautiful finished piece.

Keep your tools sharp to get the cleanest cut you can while turning with minimum tearout. Set up your grinder close to the lathe to minimize time stepping away from the lathe, and you'll probably use it more often. Yes, SAND is a 4-letter word, but spending the time to work through the grit levels to refine the surface is well worth the effort. It's still best to give yourself a cleaner turned surface to start with before you get to the sanding part!

Perfection may never be reached, but it is usually worth striving for it. Sometimes the best reward for something well done is simply to know you have accomplished it.

You know that turner whose works you admire? They started as a beginner, too! Some lessons come easy & some come harder. Experience is something you don't get until just after you needed it, so try not to make the same error twice in a row – Make a new one, and learn some more!

It's impossible to learn what you already THINK you know. Some things are meant to be closed, but your mind isn't one of them!

To spalt your own wood, mix together in a blender of food processor:

One can beer

One & a half tablespoons ammonia

One cup Miracle Grow (mixed double strength)

Oak leaves, grass clippings, or other natural materials that slowly decompose

Paint this mixture on all exposed surfaces of your green wood, and seal it tightly in a garbage bag. Put the bagged wood someplace warm (easy here in FL). Check

it in a month or so – mark your calendar to remember. How long is long enough? YOU be the judge. (P.S. Clean out the blender REALLY WELL when finished – Don't ask why!)


