Our Committee has been working hard to create a new Florida Woodturning Symposium experience for you. Our focus was to ensure a safe environment for our attendees and after review we felt that would no longer be possible at the Baptist Convention Center at Lake Yale. That started us on an exhaustive search for a new location. Although we checked out many places, the RP Funding Center in Lakeland was the one that met our needs the best. Since we have moved away from a campus location, we have shifted the structure of the Symposium to an event similar to the AAW symposium.

The 2020 Symposium will change in a number of ways:

- There is plenty of room. Each of the demonstration rooms will allow us to accommodate social distancing and will comfortably allow more attendees.
- You will need to coordinate your own accommodations and meals. There are two modern hotels on the RP Funding site. We are developing special Symposium pricing for our event. Each of these hotels has breakfast included in the pricing. We will have a lunch concession at the venue, but dinners will be on your own.

We will be having a cash bar for a meet and greet after the daily demonstrations at one of the hotels

- 1. The Instant Gallery Critique and Auction/Raffle will take place on Friday and Saturday after the Meet and Greet and end by 7:15.
- 2. For this first year we have decided to not do any workshops. Once we see how the new event works, we may bring them back in future years.
- 3. We are still working out the details about our raffle and auction and we'll keep you informed.
- 4. We have altered the schedule to give each of the demonstrators a full 90 minutes. We also start first thing Friday morning and we'll be combining both National and Regional demonstrators each day. We've also added one extra rotation for the National demonstrators, reducing you chance of missing one of your favorites.

We're still working on a number of details, but we're excited about the new Symposium. Keep checking our <u>Facebook</u> page and our <u>Website</u> to see the latest news. We'll also be mailing regular updates, so stay tuned.


# Membership
